Mammon Minute

Mammon Minute June/July 2024

As we continue to consider "wealth" and what should we do with it, I'd like to go off on what may seem a bit of a tangent. This is more lengthy, so it's probably a mammon 5 minutes rather than a minute, but please bear with me. A book that I read recently (that was a gift for my birthday) about eliminating hurry took quite an amazing and challenging turn that I didn't anticipate. The author spoke briefly about "minimalism and simplicity" and I felt personally convicted about what was said as I read, and I suspect many of you may feel the same.

"Notice that minimalism isn't just about your money and stuff; it's about your whole life. The goal isn't just to declutter your closet or garage but to declutter your life. To clear away the myriad of distractions that ratchet up our anxiety, feed us an endless stream of mind-numbing drivel, and anesthetize us to what really matters- which for those of us who apprentice under Jesus, is Jesus himself and His kingdom.

If you're a bit cynical and you're currently thinking, "Isn't this just for rich people?" Well, yes. Poor people don't call it simple living; they just call it living. They don't read books on minimalism; they pray for justice. But if you're reading this book, the odds are very high that you're not poor. Again, and with zero guilt trip, to put things in perspective, if you make \$25,000 a year or more, you're in the top 10 percent of the world's wealth. And if you make \$34,000 a year or more, you're in the top 1 percent.

Listen to Paul's command to the rich in Ephesus:

Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain... Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share. In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life. 1 Timothy 6:17-19

I read this verse for years and thought it was about somebody else. I know a few rich people; I figured this verse was about them. Not about me. I grew up thoroughly middle class. We had a home, which was a gift, but our vacations were camping or staying at my grandparent's cabin. My clothing was never name brand. I remember getting mercilessly mocked in grade school for my ugly shoes. We very seldom ate out. So I just never thought of myself as wealthy.

I also grew up hopelessly out of touch not only with global poverty but also with the way that many people, especially people of color, are living right here in our own country.

But even if I weren't rich (which, turns out, I am), I'm not off the hook; most of Jesus' teachings on money weren't to rich people. In fact, the majority of his audience was likely poor."

41st Annual BCCW: July 21-27, 2024

<u>Mission</u>: Home repair and assistance for the needy by volunteers of all ages in Baltimore County MD.

<u>Time commitment to volunteer is flexible</u>; it can be as little as one day or one or more consecutive days or every other day, etc., as well as for the entire week.



Skills needed: Willingness to follow directions from the team leader or crew chief in regard to safety and how to best assist. All skill levels, whether none or limited, are welcomed with the right attitude.

<u>Types of possible work</u>: Indoor and outdoor painting, indoor or outdoor general clean-up; ramp repair or construction (longest ramp system was 164'), porch repair or construction, minor plumbing, indoor or outdoor railings, grab bars, simple electrical repairs, gutter and downspout repairs, minor concrete or step repairs, wood fence repair or construction, caulking, wall and ceiling repairs, yard work, hauling debris, et.al.

<u>Work sites</u>: BCCW develops a spreadsheet of potential viable work sites in Baltimore County based on referrals from various County or State agencies, such as Aging, Public Health, and Social Services; other charity organizations; as well as self-referrals, including referrals from Pastors who know of a need within their congregation or community.

Registration: See www.bcchristianworkcamp.org. If attending any of the meal options, the deadline for online separate registration for each individual is on or by Sunday July 14 in order to ensure enough food for the attendees. (Volunteers may bring family as guests, who are not working during the week, to the meals if noted on the registration; there will be space to note if guests would be brought.) If only volunteering and-not-coming to any meals, there is no deadline per se; HOWEVER, a volunteer must register to allow sufficient time to be able to consult with the BCCW Chair to agree upon a work site or the volunteer can come to the Sunday night orientation after the meal. When applicable, an organization's Safe Sanctuary Policy (or equivalent) shall be followed.
